3 Way Conferences


We would like to thank our tamariki and whanau for attending our learning conferences last week. Teachers came away from these sessions really buzzing and students being clear about their goals and next steps.


Term 3 is an important time to focus on next steps and goals, especially with supporting our Year 6's getting ready to transition to Intermediate.

This month we presented the Mid Year data to the BOT. Here is the whole school data for reading, writing and mathematics.

We often find that our Mid Year data is more conservative than the End of Year data. We believe this is due to, needing more time on some aspects of each subject to get an actual picture of how akonga are doing across all achievement objectives, time at school(mainly juniors) and the shift away from national Standards to curriculum levels.

We have introduced some new assessment tools to support teachers in their judgements which links to curriculum levels.





As is consistent with local and nationwide statistics, we have more students achieving below in writing than in reading and mathematics. We have fewer students achieving below in mathematics than in the national data, but more students in reading. 27 students (14%) are achieving below in all three areas of learning. 21 students (11%) are achieving below in two areas of learning, this is generally reading and mathematics paired together. 33 students (17%) are achieving below in one area.

Teachers address individual needs within the daily programme. They are able to provide targeted learning through small groups, individual conferencing and specific learning tasks.

We also run additional programmes to support our akonga - Early Words, Rainbow Reading, Writing groups, Reading Recovery, and Reading mileage. Our wonderful Teacher Aide's do an outstanding job by supporting our classroom programmes and running some of these extra programmes for small groups or individuals. When necessary we also use outside agencies to support us. Resource Teacher of Behaviour and Learning(RTLB) work alongside teachers to create Individual Education Plans with the whanau and school.

WREMO - EMERGENCY HUB

I have met with Ana Faatoia from WREMO (Wellington Region Emergency Management Office) to discuss our school and its role as an Emergency Hub. This term WREMO will run 2 sessions here at school for our whole community of Houghton Bay. The first is about Preparedness and the second is to run through an emergency scenario as a hub for an Earthquake. 
Houghton Bay Plan & Prepare, Tuesday 3 September, 6:45pm-8:00pm

Thanks to everyone who helped out with our Matariki Treemendous working bee in June. It is now nearly two years old since this amazing makeover with help from Project Crimson https://projectcrimson.org.nz/houghton_valley_school/

We will continue our maintenance in the Treemendous landscaped area with another working bee on **Sunday 25 August 10am-1pm.**

The tasks will involve light weeding and collecting litter then spreading bark mulch over the areas, clearing unwanted tree wattle growth and the wetland swale to allow the reeds and carex to grow. Plastic mesh and metal staple pins are in this area, so strong boots and gardening gloves will be needed for this task. Some heavier work is needed to dig holes for another signage post, and maintain the ponga log edging. Please bring any gloves, tools, snacks and drinks you may need.


Ezlunch are pleased to advise that your ezlunch supplier **O'sushi** has changed their packaging for term 3, example shown below...
